Graduates receiving honors or awards are expected to attend the ceremony. Graduates should assemble in Mullaney Gymnasium by 10:15 a.m. Families are invited to attend, and tickets are not required. The ceremony is approximately one and one-half hours in length.

- Academic attire (cap and gown) is required.
- Please wear your cap with tassel hanging in front of the cap on the right side.
- The hood is not worn at this ceremony.
- Bring your cord (distributed at Cap & Gown Day) to the ceremony.
 - Academic Honors are as follows: Summa: 3.85, gold cord; Magna: 3.70, silver cord; Cum:
 3.55 white cord. When instructed, place the cord around your neck with the knot at the back and tassels hanging down the front.

All graduates are invited to attend with their guests. Tickets are not required.

Graduates should assemble in Mullaney Gymnasium by 3:00 p.m.

- Academic attire is required for graduates; attire is carried: cap with tassel, gown, and honors cords, if applicable. The hood is not worn at this ceremony.
- The procession will begin at 3:40 p.m.
- Late arriving guests will not be seated until after the processional is completed.
- An elevator is located in the lobby area of Peterson Recreation Center for guests with disabilities.
- Seating is limited in Peterson Recreation Center, but additional seating with a livestream of the event will be available in Mullaney Gymnasium.

- After Mass, students will process back to Mullaney Gymnasium in Alumni Hall before joining their families at the Family Reception on Slavin Center Lawn.
- Please designate a specific rendezvous site outdoors where your family can plan to meet after Mass.

Helpful Commencement Information

When do students order and receive their Commencement tickets, caps, and gowns?

All seniors are required to order their cap and gown online between November 21, 2024, and March 5, 2025, from www.Herffjones.com/college/graduation. Emails will be sent to seniors, weekly beginning November 21, 2024, directing them to the website. Cap & Gown Day will be held on April 9, 2025, in Slavin Center, '64 Hall from 10:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. Seniors will pick up their pre-ordered cap, gown, and honors cord (if applicable), as well as tickets to the Commencement exercises. Orders must be made by the graduating student with their providence.edu email. All guests need to be registered for a ticket by the graduate.

December 2025 Graduation Candidates

December 2025 candidates are included in all aspects of the May 2025 commencement. Candidates for December 2025 graduation participate in the May 2025 graduation ceremonies. December candidates will be included in the official commencement program, where they will be recognized as December 2025 graduation candidates. All December 2025 candidates will have their names read at the ceremony and will be eligible to walk on stage with the other graduates. If you would prefer to participate in the May 2026 commencement ceremony, you must send your request to Stefanie Calderon at graduate@providence.edu no later than February 2025.

Indebtedness to the College: What if there are unpaid bills?

Any student with an unpaid balance as of April 4, 2025, will not be able to receive their cap and gown, or tickets to the Commencement exercises, until the balance is paid in full. Tickets:

Does each guest in my party need a ticket, and is there a limit to the number of guests?

Yes, every guest needs a ticket. Graduates will receive (6) guest tickets to Commencement. Graduates do not need a ticket for entry. Tickets will be distributed to the graduates at Cap & Gown Day on April 9, 2025. All guests need to be registered for a ticket by the graduate.

How are guests registered for tickets?

Each graduate will receive an email to register their guests for Commencement. Only graduating students may register their guests and must utilize the PC student email when registering. Graduates will need your guest's full name, email, and cell phone number to complete registration and ensure their spot. Once the process is complete you will receive a confirmation email. If your guests change or you do not enter all their information, you will not be able to go back and edit your registration. Graduates contact the office of college event management and planning, via email.

Why is there a limit to Commencement tickets?

The technological projection requirements necessary to execute this ceremony at the Amica Mutual Pavilion result in a loss of approximately one-third of the arena seats. The screens ensure that all in the arena have an opportunity to get a close-up view of their graduate at the milestone moment when they approach the stage to receive their degree.

Will additional tickets be available?

Students who may require additional guest tickets are encouraged to check with classmates. Many families will not use all six guest tickets.

Will student transportation be provided to and from the Amica Mutual Pavilion?

While most graduates live off campus, there has been some inquiry regarding bus transport to the Amica Mutual Pavilion. A limited number of buses will be available for **student** transportation. The buses will depart from Concannon Circle promptly at 8:30 a.m. on Sunday, May 18 for graduates, seating is limited to members of the class of 2025. Registration is available November 21, 2024— May 2, 2025. Seating is limited and cannot be guaranteed unless your student has received an email confirmation. Graduates will need to present email confirmation upon arrival as this will be their 'ticket' to board the bus to the Amica Mutual Pavilion. The bus will be on the Sabin Street side of the Amica Mutual Pavilion for return after the ceremony.

Registration for the bus is **required** using the link provided to graduates.

What is the timing of the ceremony?

- All doors at the Amica Mutual Pavilion open at 9:00 a.m.
- The procession begins at 10:30 a.m.
- The ceremony begins at 11:00 a.m.

- The sequence of the conferral of degrees is as follows: undergraduate B.A., B.S., and Honorary Degrees.
- The ceremony ends at approximately 1:00 p.m.

Where may I take photos during the ceremony?

Each graduate will be professionally photographed by GradImages. GradImages will send graduates a color digital image; orders may then be placed directly with GradImages.

Will refreshments be available?

Light refreshments (coffee, juice, breakfast, pastries, soda) will be available for purchase in the Amica Mutual Pavilion vending area prior to the ceremony. Please refrain from eating and/or drinking in the main arena during the ceremony.

Seating:

Commencement Seating

Apart from a few reserved sections, seating is unassigned. Seats will be filled on a first come, first served basis. Families should plan to arrive at the Amica Mutual Pavilion by 9:00 a.m. to obtain the best possible seating. Candidates for B.A. and B.S. degrees sit on both sides of the Amica Mutual Pavilion floor; you will not know until the morning of graduation on which side your student will be seated. Large video screens on either side of the stage will broadcast the entire ceremony.

Are there special arrangements for persons with special needs?

Guests with special needs may access the lobby by using the ramp located on the Hilton Providence side of the building (left of the main entrance). Once inside the lobby, proceed to the main concourse area towards Sections 101, 106, 110, 120, and 124 which are reserved for persons with disabilities. Supplemental sections 104 and 126 have also been added. Members of the Friars Club (wearing white blazers and black slacks/skirts) will be posted at these sections to assist guests with special needs. Only one escort is permitted to remain with a special needs guest or guest seated in a wheelchair. Fire laws are strictly enforced and do not permit leaving wheelchairs in the aisles. A sign-language interpreter will sign the entire Commencement Exercise.

Where should we meet our graduate after the ceremony?

With thousands of people exiting the arena, plan to join your PC graduate outside the Amica Mutual Pavilion at a predetermined meeting spot.

Parking:

Providence College Security will direct you to parking for all on-campus events. Event parking for the commencement ceremony is available at various privately owned lots around the city, as well as in the garage adjacent to the Amica Mutual Pavilion. Amica Mutual Pavilion General Information

Security at the Amica Mutual Pavilion

All individuals will have to pass through metal detectors before entering the arena. Large bags of all kinds can be problematic, so we ask both graduates and guests alike to consider leaving bags at home or in your car (unless it is necessary for you to carry them with you).

Bags larger than 13 5/8" x 15 $\frac{1}{4}$ " will not be permitted through the security zone. Under some circumstances, security personnel will deem it necessary to search a bag before allowing its owner admittance to an event. Clear bags or small wristlets (4x6) are **strongly encouraged** for all events as of 9/16/2021 at the AMP. Baggage such as bags, briefcases, backpacks, and luggage are prohibited. Guests entering the arena are subject to search at the discretion of Management. The arena does not provide storage for any confiscated baggage.

This is true of events at both the Amica Mutual Pavilion and Peterson Recreation Center on campus. We encourage individuals to take advantage of the doors opening at 9:00 a.m. to give you plenty of time to get to your seats.

All camera policies are event specific. Small, personal, digital point and shoot cameras are acceptable, however, cameras with professional lenses, or detachable flashes are prohibited from the Amica Mutual Pavilion. The use of any of these items will result in disciplinary action and possible ejection from the arena.

Prohibited Items

Drugs, weapons of any kind, baggage, noisemakers, or laser pointers are prohibited at the arena. The Amica Mutual Pavilion has a no-smoking policy, and smoking is limited to outdoor spaces on the Providence College campus.

Visitors are not allowed to bring food or beverages into the Amica Mutual Pavilion.
